

In the name of God, Amen. I, Adolphus Saunders, of the County of Nanssmond, in the State of Virginia, hereby revoking all former wills and codicils by me at any time heretofore made, do hereby make, publish and declare this my last will and testament as follows:

FIRST: I direct that my body be decently buried, but without needless expense.

SECOND: If I should owe any just debts at the time of my death, I direct that the same be paid promptly.

THIRD: I give my sister, Charlotte E. Saunders, all of my personal estate of every kind and description to be absolutely hers.

FOURTH: I give and devise, in fee simple forever, to my brother, Joseph E. Saunders, the following part of my real estate, to-wit:

The tracts of land on my farm in Nanssmond County, Virginia, known as the Dick field; a part of what is known as the Barn field, or cut, and the field on which I sometime ago built a house, but the Dick field and the other field or cuts above mentioned are to be enlarged so as to include more land to be given to my brother, Joseph E. Saunders, according to the following general boundaries, to-wit: Beginning at the Dick field and continuing up to the avenue Southwestwardly thirty (30) yards, more or less, to a sweet gum tree; thence along and on said avenue Eastwardly to a pine tree; thence to another pine tree; thence to a black gum tree; then to a pine tree; thence Southeastwardly to a pine tree; then -ce in a Northwardly direction to a maple tree; thence to an iron post; thence on a shepped line in a Northward direction to the avenue leading from Adolphus Saunders to J. E. Saunders' house; thence up the avenue in a Westward direction to an iron post; thence in a Northward direction across field to a sycamore tree; thence to a poplar tree; thence down main run to the land of E. B. Gardner, it being a line gone over, designated and marked by N. T. Gray, M. C. Wright and E. B. Gardner at my request, and in case of any doubt or confusion as to this line the said N. T. Gray, M. C. Wright and E. B. Gardner can be called upon to explain and designate the same; all the land above described by said boundaries I give and devise, in fee simple forever, to my brother, Joseph E. Saunders.

FIFTH: The rest, residue and remainder of my real estate I give in fee simple forever to my sister, Charlotte E. Saunders.
