

Andrew McAtester
Will I Andrew McAtester, a resident of Suffolk Hampshire County
State of Virginia, do by this writing make my last will & testa-
ment. In the First place, I direct that my just debts, and
funeral and other legal expenses be paid.

Secondly, I give to my wife Martha for life the rents and income
of the House and lot on which I now reside, on the East side
of Main Street, Suffolk Virginia & which lies immediately north
of and adjoining the lot of Dr R. M. Webb's estate, also the rent
and income of my 2nd house and lot, and other houses, on
same lot, situated on the north side of Washington Street, Suffolk
Virginia & adjoining the Washington Hotel lot on the East, also
the interest for her life of the sum of Five hundred dollars, which
my executor will collect of monies due me and not otherwise
disposed of here, and lend out or invest in good security for that
purpose.

Thirdly: I give the use of the amount of a Bond due me by John
F Perrine, and the interest that may be due thereon when my
executor shall pay over the same, and also one hundred and fifty
dollars to my daughter Mary the wife of David L Parker to be
used by her during her life, for her, and her childrens benefit, and
at her death I give the same to her children then living and their
descendants if there be a, to take for their lives - to them and
their heirs forever, which Bond of John F Perrine is for three hundred
dollars. - The payment under this clause to be made by my executor
to my said daughter Mary as though she were a feme sole and

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my receipt shall be a full discharge to my Executor
Fourthly— whatever of Chattle estate I may have after my wife
shall break up house keeping which I desire she shall do, and
all other estate not disposed of herein, I desire shall be sold
and the proceeds equally divided and paid over to my wife
Martha and my daughter Mary— to them and their heirs forever.
Fifthly— The Summs and Lots and Money named in the second
clause of this will I give and devise at the death of my said wife
to my said daughter Mary, for life, and at her death to her children
then living and the descendants of those dead, to take per stripes
to them and their heirs forever.

Lastly— I nominate and appoint my friend John B Kelly, the
Executor of this my last will and testament;
In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and affixed my
Seal this 31st day of January one thousand eight
hundred and twenty two.

Signed, sealed and acknowledged by
the Testator as + for his last will
and Testament, before us in our presence,
all being present together,

(The words "and Money" in 5th clause intended before execution hereof
as also that part as regarding Security, also the words, "and all
other Estate not disposed of herein."

Ely his Sureties therein who justified in Oath as to their Office, saying all Homestead acts or acts, and which said bond being acknowledged by the Obligors therein is ordered to be recorded. A certificate is granted the said John R. Kelly for obtaining a probate of the said will in due form.
