Being of sound mind & memory & from bodily infirmity by being Badly burned in my extremities and knowing my self upon the attention & attendance of my sister Martha Saunders. I give & bequeath to her at my death all my chattle estate also my land called Rushworn, containing 80 acres to her & her heirs forever. But should I sell the said land, then I give her the proceeds arising from the same. I also want it understood that the 20 acres, that I sold to S. M. Cowling that I have agreed to have the line run at the starting point on Gwinns line 30 poles a Western Course & then to the back line, should any debts come against me, it is my desire that they be paid out of my estate & that my sister Martha Saunders above named have the remainder, as witness my hand this the 12th day of December 1867.
