Turner all my Personal and Real Estate that I may leave at my death In whereof I have signed this instrument as my last will at Suffolk Virginia on the day of January, 1908.

The foregoing will was this day signed by the said A. W. Turner and acknowledged as his last will in the presence of us the subscribing witness both of us being present at the same time and each of us at the request of the said A. W. Turner and in his presence subscribed the said will as subscribing witness thereto.
