Augustus H. Holland Jr.'s Will
In the name of God Amen. I, Augustus H. Holland Jr. of the County of Nansemond and State of Virginia, being of sound and disposing mind and body, do make this to be my last will & Testament, as follows:
Item 1st: I give and bequeath unto Miss Margaret M. Holland Jr. daughter of Margaret Holland Sr. the sum of Five Hundred dollars provided that if at the time of my decease such money as I am now possessed with, which is current paper money on the Banks of Virginia and North Carolina should be passible at par at the time of my decease, otherwise this item shall be revoked.
Item 2nd. I give unto William F. Holland, my brother, and his heirs forever, all the rest & residue of my moneyed estate including cash on hand, bonds, open accounts and certificates of debts of every kind, all my chatte estate of every description,

including merchandize, two horses, sulky & cart harness & gear,
I trunk & tools of every description. I do hereby nominate &
appoint William T. Holland, my brother to be executor of
this my last will & testament and do hereby declare these
present to be and contain my last will and testament.

In witness whereof I, the said testator Augustus H. Holland
Sr., have hereunto set my hand and affixed my seal, this
the 12th day of February in the year of our Lord one thousand
eight hundred and sixty two.

At a Quarterly Court held for Nassauville County, the 14th
day of November 1864.

This writing purporting to be the last will and Testament
of Augustus H. Holland Jr. late of this County deceased, was
this day presented to the Court. And there being no subscribing
witnesses to the said will, Solomon Bradshaw and James H.
Holland (of Bro.) were sworn and severally deposed, that they are
well acquainted with the hand-writing of the said Augustus H.
Holland Jr. deceased and verily believe that the said will and
the signature thereto subscribed are wholly in the hand writing
of the said Augustus H. Holland Jr. deceased. Whereupon
the same is ordered to be recorded as the true last will and
Testament of the said Augustus H. Holland Jr. deceased. And
on the motion of William T. Holland, the only Executor named
in the said will, leave is given to him to make an affidavit of due execution as the law

on the motion of William T. Holland, clerk of said court, in the said will, who made solemn affirmation as the law directs, and entered into a bond in the penalty of six thousand dollars, conditioned according to law, with Solomon Bradshaw and James W. Hollander (of Mo.) his sureties therein (who justified on oath as to their sufficiency, and which said bond being acknowledged by the obligors therein is ordered to be recorded), certificate is granted the said William T. Holland for obtaining a probat of the said will in due form.
