will

In the name of God amen I Belson N Wright of the County of
Hanover and State of Virginia made and ordained this my
last will and Testament in manner and form following to wit
First I desire that all my just debts shall be paid
Second I give to my eldest son William David Wright one hundred
Dollars;
Third: I give to my son Benjamin Franklin Wright two beds
bedstead and furniture and one hundred dollars
Fourth: I give to my Daughter, Emeline Frances, the bedstead
and furniture which is in my Room and one year schooling
Fifth I give to my Daughter Margaret, my bed bedstead and
furniture, which is now upstairs, and one year schooling.
Sixth I give to my son Stephen B Wright Fifty Dollars.
Seventh: I give to my Daughter Martha Ann Alpino Fifty Dollars.
Eighth: I give to my son Cornelius Wright, the new bedstead
Bedstead and furniture which is in the sitting room, and
the farm on which I live, and all the remainders of my
chattel Estate, after the above request have been duly paid by
my Executor hereinafter mentioned, to him and his heirs
forever.
Lastly: I nominate and appoint my son Cornelius Wright
sole Executor of this my last will and Testament; and
I request that the Court of Hanover and County require no
Security of him as my Executor aforesaid, and I further
Request that there shall be no inventory and appraisement

for sale of the property of which I may die seized possessed and possessed: and I further declare that the legacies of money herein mentioned shall be discharged in my account at the date of my death.

At a Quarterly Court held and continued for New
semond County the 14th day of November 1871
This last will and testament of Belson N. Wright late of this
county deceased was this day fully proved by the Oaths of
Peter B. Proutie and R. A. Reddick two of the subscribing witnesses
aforesaid and was thereupon ordered to be recorded, and on the motion
of Cornelius W. Wright the only executor named in the said will
who made Oath as the Law directs and entered into a bond in
the sum of three thousand dollars conditioned according
to Law (but without security) the will directing that none
should be required of him, and which said bond being acknow-
ledged by the obligor therein is ordered to be recorded, certificate is granted
thatsaid Cornelius W. Wright for obtaining a probate of the said will
