It is my will and pleasure that EVERYTHING of monetary value that I now have or may hereafter become in possession of (with hereinafter mentioned items excepted) be left in Trust to my sons, Benjamin B. --- Dumville and Samuel L. Dumville, for the sole use and benefit of my wife Fannie R. Dumville the same to be distributed by them to her in sums of Thirty Dollars (\$30.) Payable on the first day of each calendar month (if possible untill her death, or the properties shall have become exhausted. provided however that before any distribution shall have been made THAT My Doctors Bill, and Funeral Expenses must-- PAID.

It is my further will and-- desire that Certificate Deposit #4599 date September 6, 1912. at Farmers Bank of Nansmond Amount, \$ 150. Be set aside for the sole purpose of paying the funeral expenses of my wife, Fannie R. Dumville. and for no other use.

To my son Benjamin B. Dumville I leave the large portrait of myself he having expressed a desire for the same.

To my son Samuel L. Dumville I leave my Books and Bookcase, unless he shall have sooner come into possession of the same It is my especial wish and desire that my sons Benjamin B. Dumville, and Samuel L. Dumville act as executors to My Estate without compensation and that they shall not be required to give bond of any description And that I desire that each shall have full power to act in the absence of the other Thus avoiding unnecessary delays in settlement of my affairs, payments-- of monies to their Mother, As well as in the execution this and all other papers that they may have to perform.

And finally I direct that if at the death of their mother, my wife Fannie R. Dumville, there should be any residue or balance to my estate, That they erect a suitable Headstone at our graves and provided further if there should still be any surplus that they shall equally divide the same among my sons who may then be alive.
