I hereby appoint my husband George Johnson as executor of this my last will and testament and I Repts request the honorable court to exact from him no security for the performance of this trust. In the Clerk's Office of the Circuit Court of Nansemond County on Thursday the 21st day of January, 1915-

The last will and Testament of Bertha Johnson (late of this County) deceased, was this day produced before the Clerk of the Circuit Court of Nansemond County and proved according to law by the oath of W.C. Moore, one of the subscribing witnesses thereto, and is ordered to be recorded.

And on motion of George Johnson, who is named in the said Will and Testament as executor of the estate of the said Bertha Johnson, deceased, who made oath according to law, entered into and acknowledged a bond in the penalty of Two Hundred Dollars, conditioned and payable according to law, but without security (the said last will and Testament requesting that none be required of him), certificate is granted him, the same George Johnson, as Executor for obtaining a probate of said Will and Testament in due form.

And it is ordered that said bond be recorded.
