

I, Cornelius deWitt, of the City of Norfolk, State of Virginia, revoking all other wills heretofore made by me, do declare and publish this as and for my last will and testament:

1st. I wish my just debts to be paid.

2nd. All the rest and residue of my property, real, personal and mixed, of every kind and description, I give, bequeath and devise absolutely to my wife, Cecile Amelie deWitt, to do with as she may please.

3rd. I appoint my said wife the executrix of this my will, and request that she may be allowed to qualify as the executrix of this my will without giving any surety, and also that there shall be no inventory and no appraisement of my estate.

Written wholly with my own hand, and signed and sealed by me, this the second day of December in the year Nineteen hundred and four.
