Will. Virginia, being sick and weak but of a sound mind and memory do here
by make my last will and testament in manner and form following
that is to say.
1st I desire my executor here after named to sell at public sale, all the
corn, fodder, now on hand, my bacon, bees, bee-stand, vegetables in
my garden, all my cider stands, and other old stands, two small
sheats, the corn and fodder and peas, arising from the rent of my
ent crop, tools of every kind, which may be found at my death
and the money arising therefrom to pay all my just debts and ge-
neral expenses and the balance of money arising from said sales,
I give and bequeath unto James E. Howell, Malinda S. Matthews,
Mary Deans, George Anna Croft and Martha E. Howell, to be equally
divided unto them and their heirs forever.

2nd: I give unto Martha E. Howell my best bed and furniture and bedstead to her and her heirs forever.

3rd: I lend to my Nephew James E. Howell the lands on which I now live, to have the free use of said lands, until his son Miles Howell arrives to the age of twenty one years; at that age I give the said lands I loaned to James E. Howell, unto his son Miles Howell, his heirs and assigns forever.

4th: I give unto my friend Sallie M. Howell, my metal clock, to her and her heirs forever.

5. Th: I give unto my friend Edward Howell (of E) my large hog, to him and his heirs forever.

6th: I give unto my friend James M. West, my loom and all the apparatus belonging to the loom to him and his heirs forever.

7th: I give unto my Nephew James E. Howell, the balance of my beds and furniture, all the household and kitchen furniture, one ^{pair} of bureaux, one folding table, all my glass and crockery ware, to him and his heirs forever.

8. Th: I give unto my friend Sallie M. Howell, one new bed quilt, which I have not already given away to her and her heirs forever.

9. Th: I give unto Nancy Jones, wife of Demisey Jones, all my stock of sheep, to her and her heirs forever.

10. Th: All the rest of my estate, both real and personal of what nature or kind soever it may be, not before particularly disposed of I desire may be equally divided among my brother Miles Howell & heirs to them and their heirs forever.
