I Dempsey Vann of the County of Hampshire and State of Virginia
do make and publish this my last will and testament revoking
all former wills if any by me made at any other time ~~hereunto~~ made
1st thing I give to my son William H Vann, the tract of land known as
the Sycamore Franklin tract of land containing twenty acres be the same
more or less, to him and his heirs forever, 2^d thing I give to my son Alfred Vann
the tract of land, wherein the said Alfred Vann now resides ~~on~~ known as
the Brinkley tract of land containing fifty acres be the same more or
less to him and his heirs and assigns forever, 3rd thing I leave all my lands
not otherwise disposed of and all my slaves to be sold, on a credit of six
months from date of sale, and the money arising from said land and slaves
to be divided between my following children and grand children
namely; Cathrine, the wife of Peter Franklin and Mary the wife of
Daniel Watkins, and Alfred Vann, William H. Vann, Sarah E. the
wife of Russell Brinkley, and Elizabeth, wife of Jacob Brinkley to share
and equally, and my two Grand Daughters, Susan Vann, and Catherine
Vann, one half of one whole share to be divided between them, and
their heirs forever, 4th thing I give to my son Tom Vann five dollars
to him and his heirs forever, 5th thing I give Sam Dempsey Vann fifty
dollars, to him and his heirs forever, 6th thing I leave my
burial ground on my marsh plantation in Gates County N.C. to my
heirs and assigns forever, Last I do hereby nominate and appoint
my friend E.C. Riddick and my son William H Vann Executors
to this my last will and testament, whereof I have hereunto set my hand
and affixed my seal this 22nd day of March 1872
