

IN THE NAME OF GOD, AMEN:

I, J. Samuel Copeland, of Nansemond County, Virginia, being of sound mind and memory, do hereby make, publish and declare this my last will and testament, as follows, to-wit:
1st. After my death I wish my body given a decent christian burial.

2d. I desire that out of any property I may leave all my just debts if any I owe at that time, and charges of administration be paid.

3d. I give, devise and bequeath unto my beloved wife, Sarah E. Copeland, all my estate of every kind, character and description real personal and mixed, of which I may die seized or possessed, to be hers until my youngest child shall reach the age of twenty-one (21) years; after that and when my said youngest child shall have attained the age of twenty-one (21) years, then it is my will and desire and I direct that all of my said property shall pass and descend to my wife and children according to the law of descents in the State of Virginia, my wife taking her share as my widow and the other remaining part being divided among all of my said children according to such law.

I nominate and appoint my wife Sarah E. Copeland to be the Executrix of this my last will and testament, and respectfully request the court or officer before whom she may qualify not to exact any security of her as such, as I have full faith and confidence in her integrity.
