Will. I sermond County Virginia do hereby make my last will and testament revoking all former wills by me at any time heretofore made.


First I direct all my debts, and all legal expenses to be paid.

Second. I give and bequeath to my niece Virginia D. Eley, one bedstead bed and the bedding and furniture attached to the same. Third, I give and devise and bequeath to my daughter Lucy Holladay, my House and Lot in Suffolk, on the west side of Main Street, together with the lands attached and adjoining thereto, together with all my slaves and other estate of every kind & description, but if my said daughter Lucy should die before she becomes twenty one years of age and without issue, then I give all the property and estate given to her, to my daughter Fanny Smith the wife of Benj^a. D. Smith, and the children of my deceased daughter Lydia Eley - one half to the said Fanny and the other half to said Lydia's children, that may be alive at the death of said Lucy as above named. In witness whereof, I have set my hand & seal, this 10th day of December 1857.



At a Monthly Court held for Nanceman & County the 8th day of April 1867. This writing purporting the Last Will and Testament of Edith Holladay, late of this county deceased (together with a Codicil thereto) was this day presented to the Court, in order to be proved. Whereupon William Eley the only surviving witness to the said Will and Codicil, having testified in Court, that the said Edith Holladay signed and published the same in his presence as and for her last Will and Testament. That he subscribed his name as a witness thereto in the presence of the said Testatrix and at her request, and that the said Testatrix, was of sound sense and memory, as far as he knew or believed, and having also testified, that the said Robert H. Webb and Washington C. Smith, two of the other witnesses to the said Will and Codicil, who are now dead, subscribe their names here to, also in the presence of the testatrix and at her request; it is ordered that the said writing together with the Codicil thereto be recorded as the Last Will and Testament of the said Edith Holladay deceased. And John R. Kilby the executor named therein appeared in Court, and refused to take upon himself the burthen of the execution thereof.
