 In the name of God, Amen! I Ellen McAlenny, being of sound mind
 & disposing memory & calling to mind the uncertainty of human life, do make this
 to be my Last Will and Testament, as follows: I lend unto my Brother James McAlen-
 ny, during his natural life, & then I give to his heirs forever, Seventeen acres of my tract
 of Land, containing Seventy-two acres, the said Seventeen acres of Land, being the Land,
 whereon he now resides, & bounded by the Lands of Wm. J. Copel and others; and further-
 more, I lend unto John J. Copeland, during his natural life & then I give to his heirs
 forever the remaining part of my Land, that is to say Seven acres joining his the said
 John J. Copeland Land & the 17 acres given to Jas. McAlenny. And I do hereby declare
 these presents to be (and contain my Last Will and Testament. In witness whereof, the
 said testator Ellen McAlenny, have set my hand and Seal this 19th day of June,
