

FRANCIS D. CHARLTON

[Abstract: full copy in Kilby Papers:] 18 March 1843.
 Indenture between Francis D. Charlton of first part,
 Owen R. Flynn, Edward M. Browne and James B. Norfleet of
 second part, and Andrew McAlester, mutually chosen be-
 tween the parties as their trustee, of third part, all
 residing in Nansemond County. Francis D. Charlton is
 indebted to Owen R. Flynn \$310.71 by bond by bond bearing
 date with these presents and payable one day after date.
 Owen R. Flynn, Edward M. Browne and James B. Norfleet
 stand bound as the securities of Francis D. Charlton:
 bond to Jackson Powell for \$500, dated 12 Jan. 1842,
 payable two days after date, to which Owen R. Flynn
 stands as security; bond to John Mettere for \$150, date
 not recollected, to which Owen R. Flynn stands as
 security; bond to Thomas G. Benton for \$529, dated 9
 Nov. 1842, payable on demand, to which Owen R. Flynn and
 Joseph Holladay stand securities; bond to James Eley for
 \$369.63 dated 23 July 1842, payable on demand, to which
 James B. Norfleet and Edward M. Browne stand as securities;
 bond to Jacob Kelly for \$83.08 dated 2 Aug. 1842, payable
 on demand, to which Edward M. Browne stands as security.
 To indemnify securities Charlton conveys to Andrew
 McAlister a lot in the upper part of the town of Suffolk
 measuring in front 99 feet and running back to Thomas G.
 Benton's line and bounded on the north by the lot of
 Jesse Perry, on the east by the Main Street, and on the
 south and west by the lots of Thomas G. Benton, it being
 the same lot Francis D. Charlton acquired title to by
 deed from John B. Benton and Custine his wife, 8 Feb.
 1843, and is same lot John B. Benton purchased of Henly
 Herman by deed. Also Francis D. Charlton's interest
 (if any) to a fund which he is advised will accrue to
 him, arising from a cause now depending in the C[ircuit]
 S[uperior] C[ourt] of L[aw] & Ch[ancery] for Nansemond
 County under the style of William B. Whitehead &c v.
 James Lassiter, Miles Lassiter, Amos Lassiter, James P.
 Swinn and John R. Kilby. McAllister is to sell the lot
 at public auction, satisfy the debt of Flynn, and after
 that satisfy the debts of Browne and Norfleet.
