Francis D. Holladay I. Francis D. Holladay of the Town of Suffolk, County of Nansemond and  
lady's will State of Virginia, being of sound mind and memory, do make and ordain  
this writing to be my last will and testament, hereby revoking all other  
wills heretofore made by me.

Item 1st: After paying all my just debts, which I wish done as soon as  
consistent with propriety, I give and bequeath to my dear wife Emily  
S. Holladay, one half of my whole estate, both real and personal, except  
what I may hereafter dispose of, to her and her heirs forever.

Item 2d: I give and bequeath unto my son Alton F. Holladay one fourth  
of my whole estate both real and personal, except what I may hereafter  
dispose of, to him and his heirs forever.

Item 3d: I give and bequeath unto my grand son Joseph F. Holladay  
the remaining fourth of my estate, both real and personal, except  
what I may hereafter dispose of, to him and his heirs forever.

Item 4th: I give unto my sister Elizabeth Brown, all the furniture  
in the room, in my house, now occupied by her No. 13. consisting of one  
bed, stool and furniture, one wash stand, one carpet, and all the chairs in said room to her and her heirs forever.

Item 5th: The debt included in a deed in trust, which I held, or did  
I hereby relinquish and bequeath to the said Mary Ann Harris,  
held against my Sister Mrs Mary Ann Harris to her and her heirs forever,

Item 6th: I hereby empower and authorize my executors, when in their  
judgment they may think best for my estate in consultation with and  
consent of my dear wife, to sell and dispose of any or all of my estate  
either real or personal at any time and upon such terms, as they may  
think best, for a division amongst my heirs and payment of my debts.

Item 7th: I hereby appoint my executors R. C. & J. A. Hart the

one carpet, and all the chairs in said room to her and her heirs forever.

Ilem 5<sup>th</sup> The Debt included in a deed in trust, which I have, or did  
<sup>I hereby relinquish and bequeath to the said Mary Ann Harris</sup>  
hold against my Sister Mrs Mary Ann Harris to her and her heirs forever,


Ilem 6<sup>th</sup>. I hereby empower and authorize my executors, when in their



Item 4: I give and bequeath to my sister Mary Ann Harris, the sum of twenty five dollars to her and her heirs forever, in order to equalize more nearly my bequest to my sister Elizabeth Brown.
