laday's Will State of Virginia, being of sound mind and memory, do make and ordain
this writing to be my last will and testament, hereby revoking all other
wills heretofore made by me.

Item 1st: After paying all my just debts, which I wish done as soon as
consistent with propriety, I give and bequeath to my dear wife Emily
S. Holladay, one half of my whole estate, both real and personal, except
what I may hereafter dispose of, to her and her heirs forever.

Item 2nd: I give and bequeath unto my son Altho. S. Holladay one fourth
of my whole estate both real and personal, except what I may hereafter
dispose of, to him and his heirs forever.

Item 3rd: I give and bequeath unto my grandson Joseph S. Holladay
the remaining fourth of my estate, both real and personal, except
what I may hereafter dispose of, to him and his heirs forever.

Item 4th: I give unto my sister Elizabeth Brown, all the furniture
in the room, in my house, now occupied by her No 13, consisting of one
bed, stove and furniture, one wardrobe over bureau, one wash stand,
one carpet, and all the chairs in said room to her and her heirs forever.

Item 5th: The Debt includes in a deed in trust, which I have, or did.
I hereby relinquish and bequeath to the said Mary Ann ^{Harris} ~~Harris~~
Holladay against my sister Mrs Mary Ann Harris to her and her heirs forever.

Item 6th: I hereby empower and authorize my executors, when in their
judgment they may think best for my estate in consultation with and
consent of my dear wife, to sell and dispose of any or all of my estate
either real or personal at any time and upon such terms, as they may
think best, for a division amongst my heirs and payment of my debts.

Item 7th: I hereby appoint my executor, R. C. Holladay, Altho. S.

Item 2^d. I give and bequeath unto my son Alto J. Holladay the fourth of my whole estate both real and personal, except what I may hereafter dispose of, to him and his heirs forever.

Item 3^d. I give and bequeath unto my grandson Joseph J. Holladay the remaining fourth of my estate, both real and personal, except what I may hereafter dispose of, to him and his heirs forever.

Item 4th. I give unto my sister Elizabeth Brown, all the furniture in the room, in my house, now occupied by her No 13, consisting of one bed, stove and furniture, one wardrobe over bureau, one washstand, one carpet, and all the chairs in said room to her and her heirs forever.

Item 5th. The Debt included in a deed in trust, which I hold, or did. I hereby relinquish and bequeath to the said Mary Ann Harri^{ff} to hold against my sister Mrs Mary Ann Harri^{ff} to her and her heirs forever.

Item 6th. I hereby empower and authorize my executors, when in their judgment they may think best for my estate in consultation with and consent of my dear wife, to sell and dispose of any or all of my estate either real or personal at any time and upon such terms, as they may think best, for a division amongst my heirs and payment of my debts.

Item 7th. I hereby appoint my friends John R. Copeland and my son Alto J. Holladay my executors to this my last will and testament, and direct that they may be allowed by the Court to sign and endorse for each other upon their official bond upon my estate without being required to give other security. Witness my hand and seal, this 29th day of June 1868.

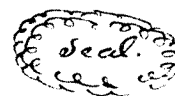

Holladay, my gold watch, to him and his heirs forever. Item 3rd I give and bequeath my silver watch to my brother in law, John G. Pinnes, to him and his heirs, forever. Item 4: I give and bequeath to my sister Mary Ann Harrips, the sum of seventy five dollars to her and her heirs forever, in order to equalize more nearly my bequest to my sister Elizabeth Brown.
