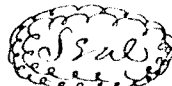

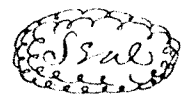
I Hamlin L. Epps, of the Upper Parish of Hanson and County State of Oregon, do make and ordain this to be my last will and testament. It is my will and desire at my death that my Executor hereafter named have the walls of my grave yard fully and permanently repaired and the same to be kept in repair out of the interest, of two hundred dollars, which I desire should be left in my Executor's hands for that purpose he accounting for the same the repairs to all to be paid for out of my estate and the remainder of Estate, to be divided in three equal parts or shares, one third part I give to my Daughter Jane R. Franklen, one third part to the Children of my deceased Daughter Sarah A. Hines. and if one of the said Children should die before its arrives at lawful age, its proportionable part, to descend to the surviving ones. The other and last third part, I give my daughter Diana O. Saunders to them my said daughter and grand children and their heirs for ever. I appoint Jane R. Franklen and James R. Saunders Executors, to this my last will and Testament.

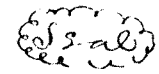


Codicil: It is my will and desire, that my Executors, have, put at the head of my and wife's grave a substantial Head Stone each, with our Names there on.

This Writing purporting to be the Last Will and Testament of Hamlin Eppes, late of this County deceased, together with a codicil hereto, was this day presented to the Court; and there being no subscribing witnesses to the said Will or Codicil, Peter B. Prentiss, John R. Kelly, and John R. Copeland, were sworn and severally deposed that they are well acquainted with the hand writing of the said Hamlin L. Eppes deceased, and verily believe that the said Will and Codicil, and the signature thereto subscribed are wholly in the hand writing of the said Hamlin L. Eppes deceased. And there being an additional Codicil to the said Will, the same was fully proved by the oaths of John R. Kelly and Wesley Kelley, subscribing witnesses to said additional Codicil. Whereupon it is ordered, that the said Will and Codicil, be recorded, as the true Last Will and Testament and Codicils thereto of the said Hamlin L. Eppes deceased. And on the motion of Javan R. Franklin and James R. Saunders, the only Executors named in the said Will, who made oath as the Law directs and entered into a Bond in the penalty of Ten thousand Dollars, conditioned according to Law with John R. Copeland and Virginia S. Kelly their sureties therein (who justified on oath as to their sufficiency and which said bond being acknowledged by the obligors therein, is ordered to be recorded) Certificate is granted the said Javan R. Franklin and James R. Saunders, for obtaining a probate of said Will and Codicils in due form.
