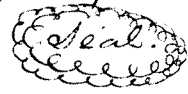


Henry Parker's I, Henry Parker, of Nansemond County and State of Virginia, do by these presents,
Will.

make this my last will and testament, hereby revoking all former wills by me at any time made. First. I give my soul to God who gave it, my body to the earth to be buried in a Christian like manner at the discretion of my herein mentioned Executors. Second, I desire that my Executors herein after named, proceed to pay my Just debts, and to enable them to do so I charge my whole Estate therewith. I leave to my beloved wife Ann Parke, during her life or so long as she remains my widow, the Tract of Land on which I live, my Filly and best Cart & wheels with the best set of Cart Harnes, Hogs, Cattle, Sheep, Farming utensils of all kinds, house hold and Kitchen furniture of all kinds, my Crop of corn, fodder, peas & potatoes, Bacon and lard, Cotton and wool, cloth of every kind, if there be any on hand to her Ann Parker during her life, or so long as she remains my widow; Now, at the death or marriage of my beloved wife Ann Parke, I then give to my children and their heirs as follows. Third. I give unto my daughter Mary, the widow of Obed E. Harrell, at the death or marriage of my beloved wife Ann Parker, fifty dollars to her and heirs for ever. Fourth. I give unto my daughter Sarah the wife of Edward R. Harrell, at the death or marriage of my beloved wife Ann Parker fifty dollars to her and heirs for ever. Fifth. I give to my son Miles Parker, one note dated December 4th 1858. for one hundred dollars, principal & interest, which he has received in my life, to him and his heirs for ever. Sixth I give to my son Joseph H. Parker (at the death of my beloved wife Ann Parker) the tract of land lying on the North side of the Road containing one hundred acres more or less, it being the same land I bought of Richard Copeland to him and one feather bed and furniture, one Cove

I then give to my children and their heirs as follows. Third. I give unto my daughter Mary, the widow of Obed E. Harrell, at the death or marriage of my beloved wife Ann Parker, fifty dollars to her and heirs for ever Fourth. I give unto my daughter Sarah the wife of Edward R. Harrell, at the death or marriage of my beloved wife Ann Parker fifty dollars to her and heirs for ever. Fifth. I give to my son Miles Parker, one note dated December 4th 1858. for one hundred dollars, principal & interest, which he has received in my life, to him and his heirs for ever Sixth. I give to my son Joseph H. Parker (at the death of my beloved wife Ann Parker) The tract of land lying on the North side of the Road containing one hundred acres more or less, it being the same land I bought of Richard Copeland to him and one feather bed and furniture, one Cow and lamb, one sow and pigs, to him his heirs and assigns for ever Seventh. I give to my son Richard H. Parker, (at the death or marriage of my beloved wife Ann Parker) one hundred and fifty dollars to be paid by my son Joseph H. Parker it being one half of the value of the tract of land which I give to my son Joseph H. Parker) which debt is not to be paid until the death or marriage of my beloved wife Ann Parker, also one feather bed and furniture, one Cow and lamb and one sow and pigs, to him his heirs for ever. Eighth. I give to my youngest son Francis E. Parker, (at the death or marriage of my beloved wife Ann Parker) the tract of land on the South of the Road with the buildings on it where I now live; also one feather bed and furniture, one Cow and lamb one sow and pigs, one little percussion gun, to him and his heirs and assigns for ever Ninth. My will and desire is, that my

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Son or Sons, who may remain with my beloved wife in aiding and assisting her in trying to get along. While she lives or remains my widow, have all the Crop of Corn and Fodder, Peas and potatoes, that They may raise or have at the time of death or Marriage of my beloved wife. Next I give to my two Grand Children, Mary L. and Henry Jackson Duke, twenty dollars, to be equally divided between them to them and their heirs for ever. Lastly, I nominate and appoint my beloved wife Ann Parker and my son Joseph H. Parker, my sole Executors, of this my last Will and Testament. in witness whereof, I have hereunto set my hand and seal, this 11. th day of September 1866.
