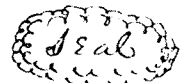

I Isaac Harrell, of the County of Gates and State of North Carolina, being of sound mind and memory but considering the uncertainty of my earthly existence do make this my last will and testament, that is to say: First: That my executors hereafter named shall provide a decent Burial for my body suitable to the wishes of my family and friends my Funeral expenses together with my just debts to be paid first: Item. I give to my beloved wife the following negro slaves, Henry, Hagar & Ches Robin, Isabel, Sella, Solomon, to have and to hold forever in fee simple. Item. I give to my beloved Daughter Martha Seneca, the following negro slave, Evelina and one hundred & fifty Dollars annually during her natural life. Item. I give and devise to my beloved Daughter, Mary Ann Hill, the following negro slaves, Ish, Winney, Maria Jane and Noah. Item: I give to my beloved children, viz: Miles Roberts, Florence Meliam, Dianah, Margaret

Hester & Isaac Samuel, the remaining part of my negroes, as follows, Abram, Sarah,
 Jack, Tom, Wiles, Ben Daniel Lewis Harrison, Nat, Little Peter. Rachel & Child Malissa
 Little Jane, Agnes, Cassandra, Ellen Edney Lee, also I give and devise to them One thousand
 dollars each, the above named negroes and their increase to have and to hold forever in fee simple
 also, it is my desire in Ten years from this date that the negroes shall be divided equally;
 divided between the four named Children. Item: I give to my beloved sons, Miles Roberts,
 Isaac Samuel, the plantation wherein I now live together with all its improvements, to
 have and to hold forever in fee simple. Item. I give and devise to my beloved Daughters
 Florence Melan & Hannah Margaret, Hester, my Farm known as the Parker place
 with all its improvements, to have and to hold forever in fee simple. Item: I give to my
 beloved Daughter Mary Ann Cole, my lot in the town of Suffolk Va. with all its improve-
 ments to have and to hold forever in fee simple. Item: It is my will and desire that all
 the money due from my Chattle Estate also all the notes or funds in any way not disposed
 of heretofore shall be equally divided between all of my lawful heirs. It is my will and
 desire that my two sons M. Roberts & I Samuel shall have a liberal Education, also my
 two little Daughters: And lastly I do hereby constitute and appoint my wife and my
 friend Joshua S. Wheeler my lawful Executors to all intents and purposes, to execute
 this my last will and testament according to the true intents and meaning of the same
 and every part and clause thereof. In witness whereof I, the said Isaac S. Barrell,
 do hereunto set my hand and seal this 20th November A.D. 1861.

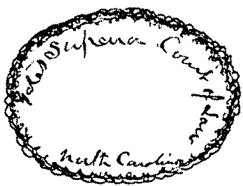
