I Isaac Johnson of Hansemond County Virginia do make, constitute, ^{publish} and declare this paper writing, to be my last will and Testament: Item 1st I direct that all my just debts and funeral expenses be paid as soon after my decease as practicable and that end Subject all my estate, both Real and Personal. Item 2^o After the payment of all my debts and funeral expenses, I dispose of the balance of my estate of every Character, both Real and Personal as follows. To my wife Chary Johnson, I give one third ($\frac{1}{3}$) thereof for and during the term of her Natural life, after the death of my said wife I give devise and bequeath the portion given her for life, together with the remaining two thirds ($\frac{2}{3}$) To my son Jackson Johnson his heirs and assigns forever provided however, that if my said son Jackson Johnson should die under the age of twenty one (21) years, that then, and in that event I give and bequeath the same to my brother Jackson Johnson, to him and his heirs forever. Item 3^o I hereby direct that there be no inventory and appraisement or public sale of any of my property.
