

James Goodman's Will
In the name of God Amen I James Goodman of the Age of
Parish of Orange County Being of sound mind and memory
calling to mind the weakness and infirmity of my body do make
constitute and ordain this to be my last will and testimony that is
to say principally and first I give and recommend my soul to god
who gave it to me and my body to the earth from which it came
as touching such temporal estate where with it has pleased god to bless
me with in this life I give and dispose of in the following manner and
form to wit: and first I bequeath to my beloved wife Priscilla Goodman
my plantation where I now live during her life or widowhood and
after her death or widowhood that may happen first I give it to my
Brother Barnes Goodman Son James Goodman and to his heirs for-
ever After I bequeath to my beloved wife Priscilla Goodman during
life or widowhood the following negroes namely Cadet Benton & wife,
Anney more senior Willis Hancey and Sam and family after his
death or widowhood which ever may happen first I give to my Brother
Barnes Goodman Son James Goodman Land & House & Farm &
Hancey & Cal family & Anney to him and his heirs and assigns forever
After I bequeath to my beloved wife all of my household and kitchening
furniture two carriage horses Billy & Charly & carriage and harness
all to Pace Cart and wheels and gear three cows and calfs and three
sons and pigs two potters and gear to bear during her life or widowhood
after her death or widowhood to go where I shall bear after give it
After I bequeath to my sister Cheary Daughey the plantation that I
purchased of Mile Daughey where she now liveth

Now I lend to my beloved wife all of my household and kitching by
furnished two carriage houses Billy & Charley & carriage and harness
also two Pace Cart and wheels and gear three cows and calfs and three
sows and pigs two pigeons and gear to bear during her life or widowhood
after bear death or widowhood to goe where I shall bear after give it
Now I lend to my sister Cheary Daugtry the plantation that I
purchased of Mile daughter where she now lives during bear life
after bear death I give it to her said Barnes daughter and to his sons
forever also I lend all of the property I have a deed in trust for against
Barn daughter to my sister Daugtry during bear life after bear
death I give it to her living children Now I lend to my sister
Cheary Daugtry one negro girl Betty during bear life after bear
death I give bear to three single daughters the youngest to bear
Eagil Now I lend to John Langston wife Nancy Langston one
negro man Sam which is in the possession and the bonds which
I had against John Langston to bear during bear life and
after bear death to bear living children and the bonds and
assigns forever Now I give unto Susan Daugtry my wife
three negroes namely Cader a boy Martha a girl and Scaly a
girl to bear and the bonds for ever Now I lend to James B. Gordon and
the plantation where he moved from joining Joseph Rebs and
others and negro man Sam during his life after his death to his
living children and to the bonds forever Now I give unto my
sister Betsy Brit two hundred dollars in Bonds which will
Bee paid out of my estate - Now I give to my Brother Benjamin

Goodman two sons Hutchings & See Goodman one hundred
 dollars each to them and their heirs forever. Item I give and
 bequeath to my niece Meany E. Howell Sawyer Howell's wife
 one hundred dollars and to her heirs forever. Item I lend to
 Dennis Goodman the John Goodman and Bartacks of land
 during his life after his death to his living children and their
 heirs forever. Item I give and bequeath unto my sister Sally
 Langston two hundred dollars in Bonds out of my Estate to her
 and her heirs forever. Item I give and bequeath to my sister Edney
 Miller two hundred dollars and to her heirs forever. Item I give
 and bequeath unto Smith Riddick Edward Riddick wife one
 hundred dollars to her and her heirs forever. Item I give and
 bequeath to my Brother James Goodman son John Goodman
 my six pds track of land to him and to his heirs forever. Item I give
 and bequeath to my Brother James Goodman son James, the track
 bought of Miles Griffis to him and to his heirs forever. Item I give
 and bequeath to Brother James Goodman my water mill in
 Gates County and to his heirs forever. Item I give and bequeath
 unto Barnes Goodman my lot in the town of Suffolk and to his
 heirs forever. Item I give and bequeath unto Benjamin
 Riddick near Scott Willis son provided he pays the amounts due
 my Estate and if he do not comply I give the said negroes to John Goodman
 my Brother Barnes Goodman son. Item I give and bequeath unto my
 my Sister Cheary daughter son Barnes Daughtry one negro boy
 Noah to him and his heirs forever. Item I give and bequeath to Barnes

Now to summe all my dears faulce. Now I give and bequeath to Barnes
Goodman the names of the following negroes and increase Amestead &
I send to take care of Prentise & Willis Bought of Barnes Parker Dec⁹
Mandey and two children bob and heare ungs child which I don't now
his name a boy Salley and his children heare and a girl and all of them
increase Lucy Mandey oldest daughter to my Brother Barnes Goodman
and to his les frin Now I give and bequeath to my sister Nancy Riddick
five hundred dollar in bonds out of my Estate to her and her hears
forever. Item I give and bequeath to my sister Catharine Duke
five hundred dollars to be paid in Bonds to be paid out of my Estate
Item I give and bequeath unto Barnes Daughter one negro boy Gilbert
and to his hears forever Item I give to my loving wife Priscilla Goodman
one years provisions of corn meat or pack an fodder for her family which
she may have and one hundred dollars in bonds Item I give and bequeath
unto my brother Barnes Goodman And sister Nancy Riddick & Catharine
Duke, all of my wifes Dower right after her death of the property I have
sent her to shear a little also I give to my house Susan Daughter fifty
Dollars out of my Estate to her and her hears forever Item give to B.
Barnes Goodman & sister Nancy Riddick & Catharine Duke all of my
property of every kind that is not heretofore named in this will to shear and
shear alike after the the death of my wife and after paying out all of the
legases I have heretofore given away. I now leave my request to Brother
Barnes Goodman to pay funal and Burial Expences and my Body to be
interred at my feathear odd place where my feathear and mother
is Buried. And it is my will and desire for my Exector to have the
place where my Body is depositt to a brick wall or some lasting
materials inclosed and laid up to

his name a boy Salley and two children Lucy and a girl and all of them
increase Lucy Mandey oldest daughter to my Brother Barnes Goodman
and to his second son I give and bequeath to my sister Nancy Riddick

Item I give and bequeath unto Barnes Daughter one negro boy Gilbert
and to his heirs forever Item I give to my loving wife Priscilla Goodman
one years provisions of Corn meat or pack an fodder for her family which
she may have and one hundred dollars in bonds Item I give and bequeath
unto my brother Barnes Goodman And sister Nancy Riddick & Catharine
Dukes, all of my wifes Dowry right after her death of the property I have
left her to she a like also I give to my niece Susan Daughter fifty
Dollars out of my Estate to have and keep her heirs forever Item give to B.
Barnes Goodman & sister Nancy Riddick & Catharine Dukes all of my
property of every kind that is not heretofore named in this will to she and
she alike after the the death of my wife and after paying out all of the
legases I have heretofore given away. I now leave my request to Brother
Barnes Goodman to pay funeral and final Expence and my Body to be
interred at my fourth odd place where my feath and mother
is Buried. And it is my will and desire for my Executor to have the
place where my Body is deposited to a brick wall or some lasting
materials inclosed and paid out of my Estate as neither of my hands

and sift my seal to this my last will and testament in the
year June 4th: 1845. I do nominate and appoint my Brother
James Goodman my sole and sole Executor to this my last will
and testament.

At a Monthly Court held for Mansfield County the 9th day
of September 1861.

This writing, purporting to be the last will and testament
of James Goodman, late of this County deceased, was this day
presented to the Court by Barnes Goodman, the Executor herein
named. And there being no subscribing witnesses to the said will,
John D. Peckin, being duly sworn deposed and said, that he
was at the house of the deceased shortly after his death and in
looking over the papers of the deceased with other individuals, he
found the paper, offered as the will, of the deceased, in a book with
valuable deeds, in an envelope and in a safe drawer; and the paper
presented to the Court, is the same paper found. - Hamlin L. Phelps,
James B. Mifflin and Wilson Mifflin, were also sworn, and swarly
deposed that they were well acquainted with the hand writing of
the said James Goodman deceased and verily believe that the
said will and the signatures thereto subscribed are wholly in the
hand writing of the said James Goodman deceased, whereupon
the same is ordered to be recorded as the true last will and testament.

James Goodman, the only Executor named in the said will,
who ~~also~~ made oath as the law directs, and entered into a bond,

C. Riddick, James & Samuel Humphrey Jones (Ley) and Wiley
Darker, (Ley.) his trustees, therein (who justified our oath as to
their sufficiency and which said Bond, being acknowledged by
the obligors therein is deemed to be recorded,) Certificate is
granted the said James Goodman, for obtaining a copy of the
said will, in due form.

Merridy, unto my said daughter Scora B. Jenkins and her heirs forever.

I now, I give and bequeath unto my beloved daughter Lucertia I. Langston, wife
of Isaac Langston, thirteen negroes, named Chloe, Nelson, Joseph, Dallas,
Taylor, Oso, Charlotte, Fanny, Maria Franklin, Morning, Anthony and Bow,
