SIXTH: I give to my son, Julian Brinkley TWENTY-FIVE DOLLARS in cash.

7th: I give to my daughter Mollie DeLoach, wife of Robt. DeLoach, TWENTY-FIVE Dollars, in cash.

Sth: I give to my said daughter, Lorah TWO HUNDRED DOLLARS in cash.

9th: The remainder and residue of money or its equivalent left, it is my will and desire that it shall be equally divided among my following children, Lorah, John W.,

And lastly, I nominate and appoint my said son John W. Brinkley, sole Executor of this, my last will and testament and desire that the Court require of him no security.
