


James Rogers  
Will.

I James Rogers of the County of Nancester State of Virginia do make and ordain this my last will and testament in manner and form following that is to say. 1st. My will and desire is that there shall be no appraisement or sale of any part of my property, either personal or real, with the exception of the tract of land set apart to me in the division of the lands of which the late Jefse Wiggins died seized and possessed, which tract of land lies on the South side of the Somerton road, adjoining the lands of B.R. Smith, the lands lately owned by Michael Howell, Richard Smith & others, containing four hundred and eighty acres, being the same more or less; which sale may be made either publickly or privately, in such way and upon such terms, as may be thought most advantageous, and with the money arising therefrom, pay all my just debts, funeral and other expenses. The balance, if any, I desire shall be thrown into my estate, to be used by my beloved wife, as best she can for her support, and the support of my childe Thomas. Repeating what is herein before stated that there shall be no sale of any part thereof, in any way.



At a Monthly Court held for Mansfield County the 10th day of May 1869.  
This Last Will and Testament of James Rogers, late of this County deceased  
was this day fully proved by the oaths of Wm. D. Rogers and Burwell R. Smith  
subscribing witnesses thereto, and was thereupon ordered to be recorded. And on  
the motion of Edwin Smith, the only Executor named in the said will who  
made oath as the law directs and entered into a bond in the sum of One thousand  
and Dollars, conditioned according to law, (but without security the will direct-  
ing that none should be required of him: and which said bond being acknowl-  
edged by the obligor therein is ordered to be recorded) Certificate is granted the  
said Edwin Smith for obtaining a probate of said will in due form.
