

Jesse Penny's  
will

I, Jesse Penny, of the town of Suffolk, County of Pasquotank,  
and State of Virginia, do hereby make this my last will and  
testament, revoking all other or former wills, by me at any time  
herefore made.

I, direct in the first place, that all my debts, and all legal  
expenses and charges, be paid:

Secondly, I direct my Executor, hereinafter named, to cancel &  
surrender to the obligors, without collecting the same, all bonds or  
other evidences of debt, due me, by the Revd Allen R. Bernard,  
D. H. Christie and James Evans, or either of them, it being my  
object and intention to release the amounts due me by them.

Thirdly, I give and bequeath unto Miss Peggy Poole, the sum of  
Five hundred dollars, to her and her heirs and assigns forever.

Fourthly, I give and bequeath to Miss Julian A. Morfleet, daughter  
of Mr. James B. Morfleet my gold watch & fixtures to her and her  
heirs and assigns forever.

Fifthly, I direct my Executor, to enclose with brick or stone, my  
grave yard, and also to pay one half of the expenses to enclose  
with brick or stone the grave yard of Mr. James B. Morfleet,  
whose part of my family are buried.

Sixthly I give and bequeath to my nephew William Kenyon,  
of Wilmington, North Carolina, five hundred dollars, to him,  
and his heirs & assigns forever.


Seventhly. The Balance of my estate, of every description,  
I give and bequeath to my heirs at law, not herein before  
named in the same manner as the Law of Virginia, would

distribute the same, to them and their heirs forever.  
Firstly, I constitute and appoint John R. Kilby, of Suffolk, my  
Executor, to carry this my Will, into effect and request the Court  
wherein he may qualify as such to require of him, no security for  
the performance and fulfilment of the trust imposed in him -

I, Jesse Perry, who have made the foregoing will, do on this 10th:  
day of June 1865, make this Codicil to the same, that is to say,  
I give to my nephew Thomas Kenyon, the sum of fifty dollars, as his  
full part of my estate: and I expressly declare that he is not to  
participate in any division of the "Balance" of my estate as provided  
for by the seventh clause of my foregoing will. My object & will being  
that the same shall go to my other heirs at law, other than himself  
or any to whom I have given a special legacy, in my said will.

At a Quarterly Court, held for Nassauond County, the 14th day  
of August 1865.

This Last will and Testament of George Perry, late of this County  
deceased, was this day fully proved by the oaths of Robertson Arnold  
and William Pierce, the subscribing witnesses hereto and a Codicil  
to the said Will annexed was also fully proved by the oaths of J. M.  
Hall and H. E. Noyflet subscribing witnesses to the said Codicil.

Whereupon, it is ordered, that the said Will and Codicil be recorded as  
the true last will and Testament and Codicil hereto of the said George  
Perry deceased. And on the motion of John R. Kelly, the only executor  
named in the said Will, who made oath as the law directs (and  
having declared the value of the Estate to be about \$4500) entered  
into a bond in the penalty of six thousand Dollars, conditioned  
according to Law, (but without security, the will directing that  
none should be required of him, and which said bond being acknowl-  
edged by the obligor thereon is deemed to be recorded.) Certificate, is  
granted the said John R. Kelly, for obtaining a probate of said Will, and  
codicil, in the form. The Internal Revenue Tax \$2.50<sup>c</sup>. having been  
paid.

Jos. J. Lawrence  
Will

I, Joseph J. Lawrence of the County of Mason in the  
State of Virginia, do hereby make and ordain this to be my last  
will and Testament in manner and form as follows:

First: I give to my son William J. Lawrence that part of the  
Ely Daughtry tract of land, lying on the North side of the road,  
to run as the road runs to the South tract of land.

Second: I give to my daughter Nancy Lawrence, the tract of land called  
the Parkersfield tract containing one hundred & eighty-six acres more  
or less, with also fifteen acres more to be cut off from my house tract,  
for the benefit of rail timber &c. Also one featherbed and furniture  
to her and to her heirs forever.

Third: I give to my daughter Martha Lawrence, the Shivers tract of land  
said to contain five hundred & thirty six acres more or less, also one  
hundred acres more or less, lying on the S. east & N. East of said tract
