

Know all men by these present that I Jno. H. Dixon, being in sound mind, doth make this my last Will ad testament, revoking any & all former Wills which may have been made by me at any time, to wit:

1st. After my just debts are paid, I give and bequeath to my beloved wife, Catharine Dixon all of my estate, both real & personal for the term of her life, provided, she does not remarry, in which contingency, she shall be entitled to a dower right in my estate.

2nd. After the death of wife, I direct my estate shall be divided equally with my children, namely: One fourth to Alice Batten, to her and her heirs forever. One fourth to Jno. Wesley Dixon, to him & his heirs forever. One fourth to Edward Wardsworth Dian, to him & his heirs forever, and one fourth to Lelia Dixon, to her & her heirs forever.

3rd. I hereby appoint my wife, Catharine Dixon, as my Executrix and doth request the Honorable Court not to exact of her any security for her faithful performance of this trust.
