being but weak in body, but of sound mind and memory do make,
publish and declare this to be my Last Will and Testament in manner
and form following (viz) Item 1st. It is my will and desire that my Execu-
tors herein after named do in the first place pay and satisfy all my
just debts.
2nd. It is my will and desire that my Executors sell my farm and land estate
either privately or publicly just as they may think for the best advantage.
3rd. It is my desire that all my stock of all kinds corn and fodder farming

utensils household furniture and kitchen utensils to be sold at public sale

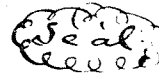
4th After paying all my just debts I give and bequeath to my sister Charlotte Rawls, all the balance of my estate.

5th and lastly I hereby nominate and appoint Adolphus Jones and Zachariah E. Holland both of the County and State of Texas the sole Executors of this my will and testament. In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and affixed my seal this 12th day of August, in the year of our Lord 1862.
