County of Hanseman State of Virginia do make this my
last will and testament, as follows, my desire is to be
buried with as little expense as decency will permit, and
that all of my debts and funeral expenses be paid as soon
after my decease as conveniently may be. The debts and
funeral expenses to be paid from the sales of my Boat, Gun
Bed & Bedding, Tools and what money that may be in hand
at the time of my decease. My Daughter Sarah Elizabeth
Branch having received the amount of two hundred
Dollars is to pay to my daughter Lucy Ann Williamson the

Sum of thirty one dollars, My Son George Wilkinson having
received the amount of two hundred dollars, is to pay to my
Daughter Lucy Ann Wilkinson the sum of one hundred and
thirty eight dollars. And I give and devise all of my tract of
land (which I purchased from John Phillips (deceased) adjoining
the lands of Ferry Point, the Davis place, the Sandy Bottom tract
and the Weatherly place) to my Son Robert Orrin Wilkinson
to do as he pleases with it the said Robert Orrin Wilkinson to
come into possession of said tract of land when he becomes twenty
one years of age, the said land to be rented, and the proceeds to be
put on trust unless the said Robert Orrin Wilkinson is an
actual need of said rent, then it is to be paid to the said
Robert Orrin Wilkinson. There is to be no timber cut off said place
except what is necessary for said place.
