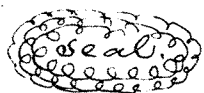

John W. Wilder's I John W. Wilder of Nansemonde County and State of Virginia, do hereby
 Will make this my last will and testament, hereby revoking all other and
 former wills by me at any time made. In the first place, I direct
 that all my just debts, and all legal and proper charges and expenses,
 be paid. Second I give to my wife, Ann Eliza just such portion of my
 estate, real, or otherwise, as the law would give her were I to die without a
 will, and to be held by her on the same terms, as the law would direct and
 prescribe. Third, the balance of my estate, of every kind and description

that I may own or be in any manner entitled to at my death, I give devise and bequeath to my Children Ann Eliza and Mary Elizabeth Wilder, and any child that may be born to me, with power and authority to my Children of our side on attaining to only one year of age, to sell or otherwise dispose of her or his portion of and interest in my estate above given to her or him. But the above gift to my said children, is subject to this condition. Should either of my children die without a child, and not having sold or otherwise disposed of her or his portion as above, then the same, or such part as may remain undisposed of in her or his lifetime, shall, at the death of such a one, go and the same is hereby given to the survivor or survivors of them, and the children of such as may at such time be dead, and should all of my children die without issue, then I give to my wife Ann Eliza, all such estate, given to my children hereby as they may not have sold or disposed of in their lifetime as aforesaid, to her my said wife forever, with the power to sell or otherwise dispose of the same. Lastly I hereby appoint my friend John S. Wright, to be the Executor of this my last will and testament, and I respectfully request the Honorable Court, to permit him to qualify as such without giving security. In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and affixed my seal, this 13th day of October 1866.

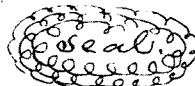
