J. Chapman*

I Jesiah Setavius Chapman being of sound mind, in the County of Nansemond and State of Virginia, this the third day of December, nineteen hundred and eighteen doth bequeath to my wife Lula Ellen Chapman at my death my entire estate, consisting of real estate personal and chattel, to be her's in fee simple so long as she remains my widow, in the event she should marry again. the property shall all be sold and the entire estate settled. My children shall receive equal portion, share and share alike, my widow to receive a child's portion. I want my widow Mrs Lula Ellen Chapman to administer on my estate and become guardian for her children bond without security. This being my last will and testament, whereof I set my hand and seal this the third day of December, nineteen hundred and eighteen.

In the office of the Clerk of the Circuit Court for the County of Nansemond on December 20th, 1918.

A paper writing dated the 3rd day of December, 1918, purporting to be the last will and testament of J.O.
