SIXTH: For the consideration above mentioned in article FIFTH I will and require that my son Fairlie F. Brinkley shall pay to each of my children (or their heirs) namely Guyosa Brinkley, Mary A. Ashburn, Susie B. Harrell and Ruth R. Harrell the sum of One Hundred dollars (\$100.00)

SEVENTH: I desire and request that my tract of land known as the "Perguson" or "Bray Jones" tract at the death of my wife, Sarah E. Brinkley, shall be owned in fee simple by my children or their heirs, namely, - Fairlie F. Brinkley, Guyosa Brinkley, Mary A. Ashburn, Susie B. Harrell and Ruth R. Harrell.

EIGHTH: I hereby nominate and appoint my son, Fairlie F. Brinkley, to be the executor of this my last will and testament without security.
