4. Fourthly, All the rest and residue of my estate, real and personal, I desire to be equally divided among Rubie M. Jones, Florida B. Jones, Garland I. Jones, Emmett G. Jones, and Mary E. Jones.

My eldest son, Clyde V. Jones, has already had his full share of my estate, and it is my desire and intention for him to have no part of my estate at my death.

5. Fifthly, I give my executor hereinafter mentioned full power to sell any of my real estate that may be required for the payment of debts, or for the payment of the \$5000.00 as mentioned above, and also for the purposes of partition among my said devisees.

6. Sixthly, I do hereby nominate and appoint George T. Rawles of Nanssmond County, my executor of this my last will and testament, with full power and authority to execute the same according to its true and intended meaning.
