all my Crockery ware all my Kitchen Furniture and Cooking utensils, all my
stock of Hogs, all my Chickens, all my Corn and ^Wo^dder, Peas, Potatoes, one
set of Measures, together with all and every species or kind of property that I
have accumulated since the death of my deceased husband Fleming Harrison
also the bond and accounts which I have paid off that was due by him at
his death and lastly I appoint John A. Davis my Executor of this my last
will and testament. In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and
affixed my seal this 20 day of Sept. in the year of our Lord 1866.


