Man, a Lewd I make this my last will and Testament after my Death I wish my, ^{Funeral}
Will expences to be paid and all my lawfull debts to be paid I give to Thos N. Beamon
two hundred dollars, to John Richard Beamon I give three hundred dollars,
to Cincencatus Virjanious Beamon I give two hundred dollars.
I also give my negroes there freedom to go to a free State if they wish, if not I give
them the liberty of being hired out as usual I also give them the liberty of chuse
ing who shall hire them I give them half of there hire every year the balance

Of these hire I give to Elizabeth Clifton and my Brother Arthur's five youngest children Louisa, Arthur, Mary, Ella, Annie Applewhites and if there should be any money left after giving the above legacies I wish my Brother's children and Elizabeth Clifton to have it. I also give my Barrow and side saddle and little bed to Elizabeth Clifton. I give my silver spoon and teapot and sugar tongs to little Joseph Lewis in Sussex if he is alive, if not I give them to Rebecca Beamon. I give to Thos H. Applewhite my large bed and furniture and one of my new bed quilts the other new quilt I give to Elizabeth Clifton after furnishing those beds I give each of my negroes the bed clothes left I give Calladonea Davis my gold watch, I give my large square hair trunk to Thomas Applewhite, I wish the balance of my trunks and clothes to be divided between my brother Arthur's children and Elizabeth Clifton after taking out such as would be usefull to my negro women, if my negroes should choose to be free I wish them to be hired out until there is no funds to bare there expences to a free state I would be glad for Dr Beaman to settle my estate. I wish my brother Arthur to receive his childrens money from my estate if there is any without giving security in this state:

At a Quarterly Court held for Mansumond County the 14th day of June 1869. This writing purporting to be the Last Will and Testament of Mary A Lewis, late of this County, deceased was this day presented to the Court, and there being no subscribing witnesses Thos Richard H Beamon and Willis E. Cohoon were sworn and severally depozed that they were well acquainted with the Testatrix's hand writing and verily believe the said writing and the name there to subscribed to be wholly written by the Testatrix's own hand whereupon the said writing is ordered to be recorded as the true Last Will and Testament of the said Mary A Lewis deceased. And on the motion of Richard H. Beamon, the only Executor named in the said will who made oath as the law directs and entered into a bond in the penalty of Eight Hundred Dollars conditioned according to law with Alexander Savage his Surety there in
