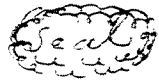

Ames, the only Executor named in the said will, who made oath as the Law directs and entered into a bond in the penalty of Five thousand Dollars (conditioned according to Law, but without security the will directing that none should be required of him, and which said bond being acknowledged by the obligor thereon, is ordered to be recorded) Certificate is granted the said John W. Ames, for obtaining a probate of said Will in due form.
