I, Garrison Cress, of the County of Nansemond, in the State of Virginia, hereby revoking all former wills by me at any time made, do hereby make my last will and testament, as follows:

1. I desire that my body may be decently buried, without needless expense, and that a grave stone be erected at my grave, which shall be in keeping with my estate and station in life.

2. I direct that my just debts be paid as soon after my death as conveniently may be, and to that end charge my whole estate, real and personal, with the same.

3. I give and devise to my wife Luvania Cress, for and during her life, as long as she remains my widow, my farm in Nansemond County, Virginia, upon which I now reside (my home place) together with all household and kitchen furniture, carts, wagons, buggies, harness, agricultural and other implements, and goods of all kind used upon the said land; growing crops, and provisions of all sorts laid in for family consumption. Upon the death or marriage of my wife, I give and devise the above described property to my grand son Lezier Cress. But if my grand son Lezier Cress should die without lawful issue, in that event I devise the said land to my relatives Clinton Dillard, Elijah Brown and John H. Holland, share and share alike.
