Walters, and the third of said Parts I give to the children of my sister Fanny C. Simmons, living at my death, to be equally divided among them: but if either my sister Georgeana or my sister Virginia I., should die before me, then I devise my said estate to be divided into two equal Parts one of which I give to the sister who may survive, and the other I give to the children of my sister Fanny C. Simmons, living at my death, and if both my said sisters Georgeana and Virginia I. should die before me, then I give my whole estate to the children of my sister Fanny C. Simmons, living at my death.
