VIRGINIA:

In the Clerk's Office of the Circuit Court of Nansemond County, on Friday the 12th day of February, 1915-

A paper writing purporting to be the last will and testament of Mary J. Sullivan, (late of this county) deceased, was this day produced before the Clerk of this Court by John H. Robbins, and there being no subscribing witnesses thereto, R.N. Powell and Arthur Powell, were sworn and deposed that they were acquainted with the handwriting of the testator and verily believe the said writing and the name thereto subscribed to be wholly written by the own hand of the testator. Whereupon, the said writing is ordered to be recorded as the true last will and testament of the said Mary J. Sullivan, deceased.

On motion of John H. Robbins, who made oath as the law directs and together with Annie E. Houseman, his surety (who justified on oath as to her sufficiency) entered into and acknowledged a bond in the penalty of One Thousand Dollars, with condition according to law, certificate is granted him, the said John H. Robbins for obtaining letters of administration on the estate of Mary J. Sullivan, deceased, with the last will and testament of said deceased annexed in due form.

And it is ordered that this bond be recorded.
