I, Mills Godwin of the County of Nansemend being of rather imperfect health of body at present, but of sound mind, . Considering the certainty of death , the unsertainty of the time it may happen and the propriety of arranging my wordly affairs, have determined to make this my last will and testament in manner and form following, that is to say, first, I give and devise to my sen Thomas H. P. Gedwin and to his heirs forever the land and plantation whereon I new live with all and singular its advantages whatseever, ene half of which he is to pessess at my death and the ether half at the death of his mother, futher, I give and bequeath to my said sen and to his heirs for ear the fellowing slaves namely Cyrus & Betty and Wharten. I also give and bequeath to my said sen the herse which is new called his and being the herse I had > from Weatherly, my mahogany buffett and sideboard, two beds and furniture, one yoke of exen and one still (with its furniture) of his choice, four caws and fifteen sheep, my silver tankerd and six silver speems marked T. G. to him and his heirs forever. Secondly, To my two daughters Louisa Caroline Hall and Ann Gray Holladay I give and bequeath and confirm all the preperty I have heretefore pessessed them of severally and I give and bequeath to them equally between them and their decemdents the remainder and reversion of all the personal property herein after given to my beloved wife during her natural life. I give to my grand daughter Eliza Sarsh Kensey Randelph my negre girl Ellen to her and her heirs fere er. Thirdly, I lend to my beloved wife Sarah the use and eccupation of one helf of my dwelling house and out houses as also one half of my land, plantation, orthards and gardons where we new live and one brandy still and furniture, also I lend to her all and every part of my personal estate which shall not be otherwise dispesed of, in and by this will and testament for and during her natural life, and at her death to pass as I have herein before directed, that is to say, the estate so lent to my said son the personal estate so lent to my said daughters and their descendents, a sufficienty of my other property such as my wife can best spare, for the payment of all my just debts and the disbursement or costs of administration . Lastly, I meminate and appoint my beleved sen Thomas H. P. Gedwin and my sen in law James Helladay executers of this my last will and testament, and desire that no security of any kind may be required from them having full and perfect confidence it will not be necessary. In evidence of all which I hereunte sign my name and affix my seal this 21st day of August in the year of Christ one thousand eight hundred and twenty-two. Signed, sealed and delivered by the said Mills Godwin as and for his last will Mills Godwin (SEAL) and testament in presence of

Jehn Gedwin, Hess Munger Jeseph Gedwin, Jeseph W. Heekkey.

This Testament and last will of Mills Godwin dee'd, was put into Court by Themas H. P. Redwin and James Helladay the executors therein maked and swern to my them and being proved of the said executors certificate was granted them for obtaining a probate thereof in due form they having made outh and embered into bend in the penalty of ten theusand dellars, conditioned according to law (without security the will requiring none)
