will

I Nathaniel P. Phillips of the County of Hanseman and State of Virginia, being of Sound mind, do make and ordain this to be my last will and Testament, to wit. I give and bequeath to my sons Nathl M. and Logan Phillips my place and great mill with all its appurtenances, with garden, acres of land attached & thereto, also a tract of twenty one acres purchased of Robt. A. Pinner adjoining the same, to them and their heirs forever.

2nd I give and bequeath to my son Wm H. Phillips the sum of Seven hundred dollars, to be paid out of my Suffolk City Scrip which will be due on the 6th day of April next. to him and his heirs forever.

3rd I give and bequeath further to my son Logan Phillips the sum of three hundred dollars to be paid out of the afore mentioned City Scrip. It being my desire that these respective amounts of Seven Hundred and Three Hundred dollars be handed over in Scrip to the said Wm H. and Logan Phillips.

4th I give and bequeath to my son in Law Albert B. Hargrave in addition to what I have already given him the following land described as follows viz let the present dividing line between his Residence and mine be extended across the road to the Northern limit of my plantation, all the land lying North of the Road and East of said line. I give to said Albert B. Hargrave he to pay to my aforesaid son Wm H. Phillips the sum of One Hundred dollars.

5th I give and bequeath to my Daughter Mary Virginia Phillips the sum of One Hundred dollars to be paid out of the same City Scrip.

Seven hundred dollars, to be paid out of my ~~estate~~
scrip which will be due on the 6th day of April next, to him
and his heirs forever.

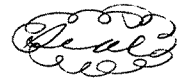
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sum of three hundred dollars to be paid out of the afore-
