1st I want all of my honest debts paid, I give and bequeath unto my wife Martha J Ashburn all of my property both personal and real to use as she wants during her life and at her death to be divided equally between my sister Mary Allise King and my brothers Frank N. Ashburn and Buck Ashburn.

I appoint my wife Martha J. Ashburn as executer of this will, without bond and give her authority to sell such chattel property as she may desire.

In the Clerk's office of the Circuit Court of Nansemond County the 8th day of September, 1919.

The last will and testament of Robert W.
