Downing were sworn and severally deposed that they are well acquainted with the testator's handwriting, and verily believe the said writing, and the name thereto subscribed, to be wholly written by the testator's own hand. Whereupon the said writing is ordered to be recorded, as the true last will and testament of the said Sallie McLenny deceased.

And on motion of Arthur McLenny, he is appointed Administrator of the estate of Sallie McLenny, deceased, he the said Arthur McLenny having taken the oaths required by law together with J.C. Downing, his surety, entered into and acknowledged a bond in the penalty of Sixteen Hundred (\$1600.00) Dollars conditioned and payable according to law, which bond is ordered to be recorded.

Certificate is granted the said Arthur McLenny, Administrator as aforesaid, for obtaining a probate of said will in due form.
