And on motion of Arthur McClenney, he is appointed Administrator of the estate of Sallie McClenney, deceased, he the said Arthur McClenney having took the oaths required by law together with J.C. Downing, his surety, entered into and acknowledged a bond in the penalty of Sixteen Hundred (\$1600.00) Dollars conditioned and payable according to law, which bond is ordered to be recorded.

Certificate is granted the said Arthur McClenney, Administrator as aforesaid, for obtaining a probate of said will in due form.
