

Copy of Will  
of Sallie  
W. Mayo

I, Sallie W. Mayo, of Suffolk, Virginia, being of sound and disposing mind, do hereby make, publish, and declare this to be my last will and testament, hereby revoking all other wills by me at this time made;

1. I direct that all my just debts shall be paid; and if the debts due me, and the proceeds of the sale of my perishable property be insufficient for that purpose, my executors are authorized to sell so much of my other estate, real and personal, as may be necessary.

2. I hereby give, devise and bequeath unto the "Society for the Protection of Destitute Roman Catholic Children at the City of Buffalo", a corporation created and existing under the laws of the State of New York, the sum of Fifty (50) Dollars, to have and to hold unto the said Society, forever for the purpose for which it is incorporated, or for any other purpose which it may hereafter be authorized to accomplish.

3. I hereby give, devise and bequeath unto Rev. T. J. Hegarty, of Assembly Street, Columbia, S.C., the sum of Fifty (50) Dollars.

4. I bequeath my wedding ring to the Catholic Priest, living and having charge of the Catholic Church in Portsmouth, Virginia, at the time of my death, for the purpose of making a Chalice.

5. I bequeath to my sister's children Lester and Christine Rice each, the sum of Five (5) dollars.

6. I give to Wallace S. Walton the sum of Fifty-four (54) Dollars, owing to me from the said Wallace S. Walton, and all interest accrued or to accrue hereafter,

7. I bequeath Mr. Mayo's watch to his mother; but in case she shall die in my lifetime, then I bequeath the same to John Cowan of Wilmington, NC.

8. I give to Edward B. Walton the cuff buttons that belonged to Mr. Mayo, my bracelet, silver hand mirror and gold pens.

9. I devise and bequeath all the residue of my real and personal estate; whatsoever and wheresoever, unto Edward B. Walton of Suffolk, Virginia, his heirs, executors, administrators and assigns, according to the nature thereof respectively, for his and their absolute use and benefit.

10. I do hereby nominate and appoint Edward B. Walton and W. L. Bailey of the City of Suffolk Virginia, executors of this my last will and testament, with full power and authority to execute the same according to its true and intended meaning, and having perfect confidence in their judgment and integrity, I direct that the said executors shall not give security.
