Joseph Saunders I. Joseph Saunders of Nansemond County State of Virginia do hereby make my
Will last will and testament, in the manner and form following that is to say 1st. I desire that a sufficiency of my perishable estate be immediately sold after my decease, for the purpose of paying all my just debts and funeral expenses. 2nd. after all my just debts and funeral expenses shall have been paid, I give unto ^{my} wife Edith Saunders, during her natural or widowhood, all the balance of my estate, both real and personal: with this proviso nevertheless that my said wife, is to pay to my Daughter Nancy Saunders, the sum of twenty dollars, in money: but my wife is hereby allowed two years, from my death to pay the said twenty dollars. 3th. after the death of my wife, I give to my son Thomas: Saunders, my upper Plantation joining the lands of Hugh N. Williams and Isaac V. Luke, and cornering on Charles Oliver's land. 4th. after the death of my wife, I give to my son George Saunders, my ^{lower} Plantation or old farm, joining Charles Oliver at a corner pine, and runs to a haw-bush, on the main road, where it corners. 5th. It is my desire that if my son George Saunders shall die before he arrives to the age of twenty one, that my son Thomas Saunders, shall heir George Saunders, patron or portions. 7th. after the death of my wife, it is my desire that the balance of my estate, be equally divided between my other children not heretofore named in this will, except my daughter.
