2nd I give unto Annie King, the daughter of my neighbor Jas R. King, the sum of two hundred dollars, to her and her heirs.

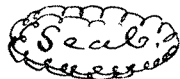

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At a Monthly Court held for Nansemond County the 8th day of October 1866. This last Will and Testament of Sarah J. Elliott late of this County deceased was this day fully proved by the Oath of R. H. Saunders and the solemn affirmation of Edwin Smith subscribing witnesses thereto, and was thereupon ordered to be recorded. And on the motion of John R. Kilby the only Executor named in the said Will, who made oath as the law directs and entered into a Bond in the penalty of Seven thousand dollars conditioned according to law with Thomas J. Kilby, Henning E. Smith, Peter B. Prentiss and Edwin Smith his securities herein (who justified on oath as to their sufficiency and which said bond being acknowledged by the obligors therein is ordered to be recorded) Certificate is granted the said John R. Kilby for obtaining a probat of the said Will in due form.

Joyner that part of my land lying East of a path running strait from the Corner of William Ayres, fence to a bottom west of William's semi hole.
