

Will of
Temphia J.
Dillard

In the name of God Amen, I Temphia J. Dillard do make this my last will and testament. First. I give and bequeath unto my two brothers Israel and Nehemiah Sumner to be divided equally the following property, All of that certain tract of land in Nely Neck district Nansemond County, Va., near South Quay Church and bounded on the north by the lands of P. O. Duck on east by the lands of Garrison Cress and A. N. Dillard, on the south by the lands of Louis Jones and Joseph Holland and on the west by the lands of Louis Jones and contains about fifty acres the said property is to the said Nehemiah and Israel Sumner and their heirs and in the event that the said Nehemiah and Israel Sumner should die without heirs then the said tract of land shall be the property of Essie L. Sumner the daughter of J. H. Sumner.

Second:-

I give and bequeath all the balance of my estate both personal and real to my brother Jack H. Sumner.

I hereby appoint my brother J. H. Sumner executor of this will.

I hereby revoke all previous wills made by me.
