Will and Testament, in manner and form following to wit:  
I give and bequeath to my wife Nancy Benn one third of  
the farm I now live upon; also one third of the Swamp  
lands so called her life & the other two thirds I give to be  
divided equally among my children. My farm situated on the  
Western Branch called Burnes, I give unto my daughter  
Eliza S. J. Hodges, and my son Thomas S. Benn them  
and their heirs forever, another piece of land situated on  
the Western Branch and Craney Creek called Hatties, I  
give unto my two daughters Mary Hale Benn and Julia  
Armstrong Benn, them and their heirs forever; another piece  
of land, which formerly belonged to Bolley's estate & called  
Timber Land. I give my right and title in the same to  
my two daughters, Mary Hale Benn, and Julia Armstrong  
Benn, them and their heirs. This lots situated near  
Fort Norfolk. I give unto my daughter Eliza S. J. Hodges  
and my son Thomas S. Benn them and their heirs forever  
I give to my wife Nancy Benn in lieu of her dues  
one third of all my slaves during her life, and the  
other two thirds to be equally divided among my children  
I also give my wife Nancy Benn, one third of all my  
chattels

and Sound memory, do make and ordain this my last  
Will and Testament, in manner and form following to wit:  
I give and bequeath to my wife Nancy Benn one third of

and my son Thomas S. Benn them and their heirs forever  
I give to my wife Nancy Benn in lieu of her dower  
one third of all my slaves during her life, and the  
other two thirds to be equally divided among my children  
I also give my wife Nancy Benn, one third of all my  
chattle Estate former in place of her dower in the same  
and the remainder to be divided equally among my children  
And I hereby make and ordain my beloved wife and

Her Esteemed Brother Thomas Lamb, Executor of this my last will and  
testament.
