W. C. Smith's I do solemnly affirm that this is my last will & testament,  
made on this the sixth day of September one thousand eight hun-  
dred & sixty four unto H. C. Smith my brother I give all land  
belonging to me that lies on the west side of the Somerton road  
& unto R. R. Smith my brother I give all land laying on the east  
side of said road I also give unto R. R. Smith the four negroes  
now in my possession namely Lucy, Moses, Addeline & Anna.  
My bonds, State & City Stocks & money if any I desire to be equally  
divided between the above named persons also all negroes that  
may be captured or returned belonging to my estate. Should  
H. C. & R. R. Smith my brothers, be killed during this war I  
desire that the whole of my estate both real & personal be  
appropriated to the education of soldiers & poor people's children  
in the upper district of Mansfield County by the establishment  
of one or two free schools, the said schools to be conducted upon  
the plan of the freed schools in the lower district of said  
County.

At a monthly Court held for Mansfield County,

The 11th day of September 1865. This writing purporting to be  
 the last Will and Testament of Washington C. Smith, late of this  
 County deceased, was this day presented to the Court, and there  
 being no subscribing witnesses to the said will, Peter B. Prentis  
 and Willis S. Riddick were sworn and severally deposed that they  
 are well acquainted with the hand writing of the said Washington  
 C. Smith deceased, and verily believe that the said will and  
 signature scents subscribed are wholly in the hand writing of the  
 said Washington C. Smith deceased. Whereupon, the same is  
 ordered to be recorded as the true last will and testament of the  
 said Washington C. Smith deceased. And on the motion of  
 John R. Kilby, who made oath as the law directs and having  
 declared the value of the estate to be about Five thousand dollars  
 and entered into a bond in the penalty of Seven thousand dollars,  
 conditioned according to law, with Hunning C. Smith, his security  
 therein (who justified on oath as to his sufficiency and which said  
 bond being acknowledged by the obligors therein is ordered to be recorded),  
 certificate is granted him for obtaining letters of administration  
 on the Estate of the said Washington C. Smith deceased with his will  
 aforesaid annexed in due form (The Internal Revenue Tax \$3,50<sup>c</sup>  
 having been paid)
