

William Joyner's April 5th. 1866. In the Name of God Amen. I William Joyner of the County of
Nance-mond State of Virginia being of sound mind and memory do therefore
make, ordain, publish and declare, this to be my last Will and Testament.
1st. My desire is that my just debts to be paid after words I give and dispose
of as follows. 1^o. I leave to my beloved wife Diana Joyner my land
on which I live with all my chattel estate being of what nature or kind, dur-
ing her natural life.

2^o. After her decease, hereby revoking all former wills by me made. I give and
bequeath to my son James T. Joyner that part of my land lying East of a path run-
ning strack from the corner of William Ayres, fence to a bottom West of William's
sun hole. I also give and bequeath to my son Josiah, over the balance of
my land on which I live, with all my chattel estate being of what nature
or kind. I also give to my son Moses Joyner and my daughter Mary five
dollars each. I give to my son Benjamin Joyner's children five dollars
to my son William Joyner's child five dollars to be their Ayres or Abigail
for ever. In witness whereof I have hereunto subscribed my name and
affixed my seal.
